Mexico mission-churches are in the finishing stages of establishing a non-profit organization in Mexico to help further the humanitarian work being done within their communities.

"Ysleta Lutheran Mission is excited to be partnering with Frutos de Gracia," Rev. Dr. Karl Heimer, CEO of YLM, shared enthusiastically, "They will continue to be a source of support for their communities and grow in new and different ways."

LOVING THE DISPLACED

In December, El Paso made national news as thousands of migrants, most of them from Venezuela, turned themselves into the US Border Patrol before being released into El Paso. Many were housed in shelters while being processed, but soon, lack of space had many living in the streets of downtown El Paso as they waited to be processed.

Members of San Pablo Lutheran Church gathered together after their worship service the second Sunday of the new year to assemble 150 meals, which consisted of homemade burritos, chips, cookies, and bottled water, along with over 100 candy children bags for distribute to these displaced migrants.







ADELANTE MUSIC STUDENTS

Children and youth not only learn to play an instrument through the Adelante Ministry classes, but are also given the opportunity to perform, and even travel, with Mariachi San Pablo.

"Many of these kids and teenagers grow in their playing abilities," Miguel, director of Mariachi San Pablo, shared, "And with time, they become part of Mariachi San Pablo, getting to experience new places and people in their mission to share the Gospel mariachi style."

From eight years of age to fifteen, these students have been receiving weekly lessons for the last few months, learning to play guitar, vihuela, guitarron and violin. As the year progresses, plans are being made for these Adelante students to join Mariachi San Pablo in future performances, in El Paso and out of town, and they are needing mariachi suits.

A NEW BATCH of **DEACONESSES**



Last May, four women of La Santa Biblia, who began the deaconess virtual three-year program with the seminary in the Dominican Republic in 2019, graduated with an associate's degree. They have been serving at three of the Juarez mission-churches we partner with, helping to provide care and instruction to the congregations.

This February, four women, along with Pastor Stephen Heimer from Zion Lutheran Church, made the trip to Mexico City, where they did their introductory intensive deaconess course, learning the role of the deaconess within the church and the commitment to God's Word required as they

progress through their courses for the next three years.

We are excited to see the growing leadership in the Juarez mission-churches! May God continue to raise up church-workers and leaders among these congregations we have partnered with for over two decades.

EDUCATING &TRAINING

The Mexico deaconesses partnering with YLM who experienced a Days for Girls International workshop are now brainstorming of ways they could help their congregations and communities through the education of the health and protection of girls and women.

In conjunction with the Mexico deaconesses, Kathy Carter, ARNP from Lincoln, NE (Common Thread Ministry), was able to bring these education workshops to a secondary school in Juarez, where three deaconesses were exposed to information they hadn't been taught at school or by their mothers.

"Talking about menstruation has been taboo for many years," a future Mexico deaconess shared after a training session, "My mother never told me about my period, and now, no one talks about menopause."

"We see how vital it is for this education to be done," Rosy Lira, lead deaconess for the Mexico missions, shared before the first training session, "Not just for girls and women in our congregations, but also for women in Juarez prisons, migrants in shelters, and even indigenous women living up in the mountains of Chihuahua."





Erika Tovar, wife to Pastor Misael Tovar, has begun to gather women from the two Chihuahua missions to educate on the Days for Girls curriculum, excited to see how they can work together to further educate girls and women within their communities.

"These are things they deal with daily but are not informed about," she shared as she went through the curriculum, "What a practical and simple way to open new doors for God's love to walk into their lives."















BLESSED TO BE A BLESSING

The one thing all Servant Event teams serving through YLM have in common is a desire to be a blessing to others.

GRATEFUL' HEARTS


